Did You Know? Anabaptist Origins

The Anabaptist movement began in **1525** in Zurich, Switzerland, when a small group of young adults gathered in a home and baptized each other — choosing faith freely, rather than by state mandate.

"Anabaptist" means "rebaptizer" — a nickname given (not kindly!) by those who opposed them.

Early Anabaptists believed following Jesus meant more than believing the right things — it meant living differently: loving enemies, sharing resources, telling the truth, and refusing to take up arms.
